Artist's Statement:

"These flags are carved so that they stand out from the wall. I burn the wood both front and back, then paint front and back and carve the stars. I seal it with a clear coat. I mount D rings with a wire to hang from. I make them from 2x4's and the flag is approximately 36 inches long."

Wendy's flags, like her rings, are very popular. She said she was working on her ninth flag of the day. It is very evident that these are outstanding pieces of wood-art. Hopefully we'll be able to see one of these flags in person soon.
