## **Microwave Drying**

If you work with wet wood be sure to keep it well wrapped in plastic between carving sessions and if there is a delay, put it in the freezer until ready to carve and finish.

To dry in the microwave, start with a bag of popcorn, time it, divide that number in half. That is how many seconds you will start with to dry.

Weigh your carving, dry for x seconds, weigh again, let it cool, then do it again, and again, and again, up to 50 times or more.

Write down the weights each time. When you finally get to the point where there is no difference between the entrance weight and the exit weight, your piece is probably dry.

Cracks may form during this process but as it dries they should close.
